HISTORY

The **Sessions Clock Company** of Forestville, Connecticut is one of the great names in American horological history, tracing its origins to 1831 and the early wooden-movement shelf clocks of Elisha N. Welch. Reorganized under William and Albert Sessions in 1903, the company became one of America's most prolific and beloved clock manufacturers. In the 1930s, Sessions recognized the transformative power of electrification and boldly expanded into **synchronized electric clock movements** — producing both practical timekeeping instruments and exquisitely whimsical **novelty figural mantel clocks** that became some of the most admired decorative objects of the Art Deco era. This stunning example is a **figural carriage clock** — a porcelain coach body in rich pink and white with gold gilt accents, mounted on an ornate brass frame with spoked carriage wheels, pulled by a pair of detailed brass horses in full harness. The electric Sessions movement is set into the coach body behind a round Roman numeral dial. This romantic, fairy-tale style — evoking Cinderella's coach — was enormously popular in the 1930s–1950s and represents some of the most collectible Sessions production. The company continued until 1969, but the 1930s electric novelty figural clocks remain the most prized by today's collectors.

COLLECTOR NOTES

Sessions figural electric novelty clocks from the 1930s are among the most actively collected American clocks of the 20th century, beloved for their combination of whimsical decorative form and reliable American engineering. The **horse-and-carriage / coach form** is one of the most desirable figural types, and examples with **porcelain coach bodies in pink and gold with brass horse pairs** consistently command strong prices. Working examples are significantly more valuable than non-working ones — a fully functional clock like this is immediately usable and display-ready. Comparable working Sessions carriage and figural horse-and-coach clocks sell in the **\$95–\$225 range** on eBay, Etsy, and Chairish, with exceptional examples in perfect condition reaching higher. The combination of the elaborate porcelain coachwork, brass horses, brass spoke wheels, and working electric movement makes this a standout piece of American Art Deco decorative horology.
